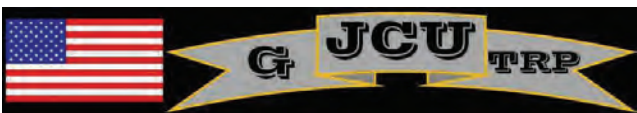

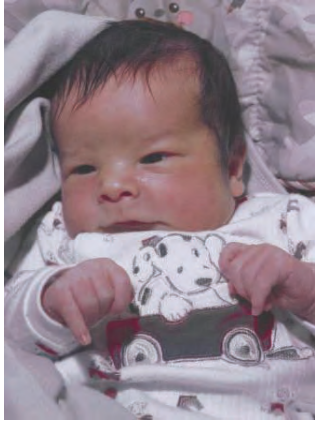

# JFK-50 Mile Hagerstown, Maryland (America's Ultra-marathon)



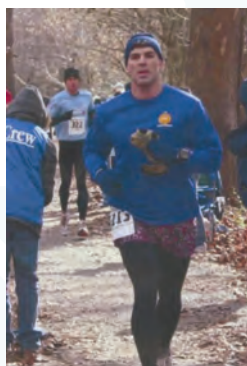
This year marked the 46th Annual JFK-50 Mile Ultra-marathon. As with every year, it was an outstanding event. We had 46 runners compete this year, 20 of our own and 26 friends of the community that were either here at one time or that we work with us around the globe. This year was extremely cold and windy. Water bottles and camelbacks froze, the aide stations were serving frozen water, coke slushies and banana sickles. The JCU record of 9:17, held by Ken Klynstra was smashed by Jay Pylman with a very impressive 8:53. There were more 1st time runners than any year previously, congratulations to everyone that participated this year. For the 5:00am starters it was a brisk 19 degrees that quickly dropped to 5 degrees on the trail. More runners started at 7:00am this year than in years past. The Appalachian Trail was still as brutal as always and the C&O Canal path was still 26 miles by itself. There were no major injuries to

note as of right now, just a few twisted ankles, but the crew survived and lived to tell their stories. This year marked the first time we put together a military team. Our team, "Haigh's Heroes" placed second overall in the military team competition. The ten member team time comes from the first five members to cross the finish line, those five were Jay Pylman, Chris Lewallen, Jeff Eldred, Ken Klynstra and Matt Heist, great job guys. 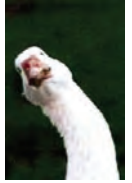

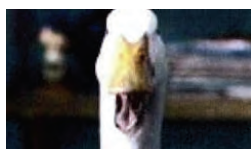
