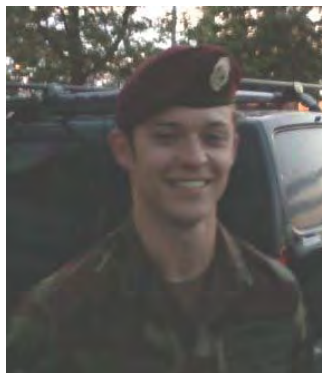
As always, there have been many moving parts throughout the month. Augie Marks graduated from the U.S. Navy's Leading

thank the families for supporting their loved ones.

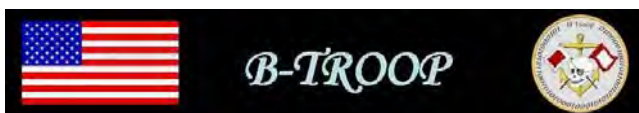

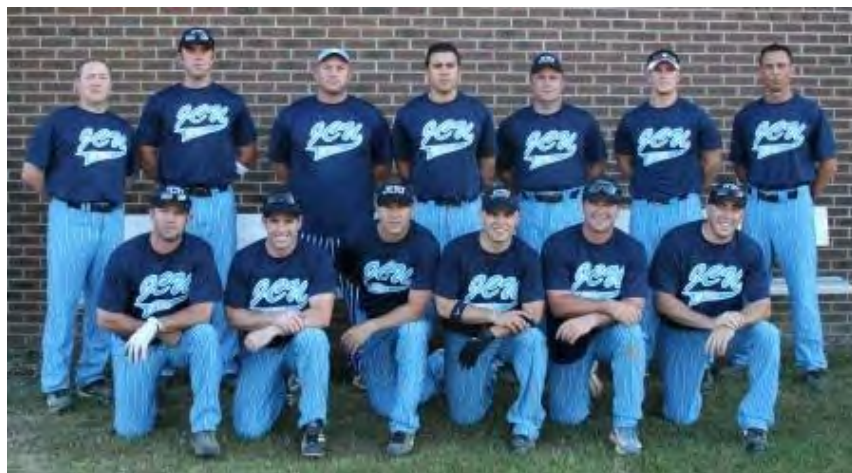
### The proud tradition of JCU Softball
