together first class trips for couples, singles, or families. We'll keep you posted in the newsletters about upcoming events.

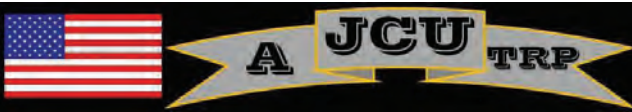

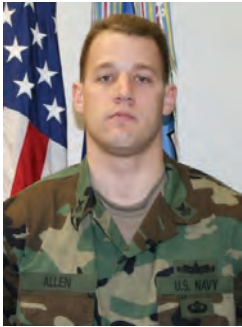
Answer to last months RETRO JCU ? (did you guess correctly?)

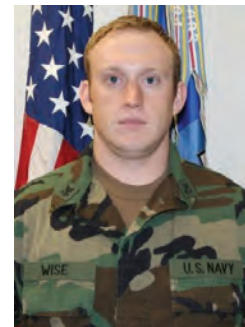

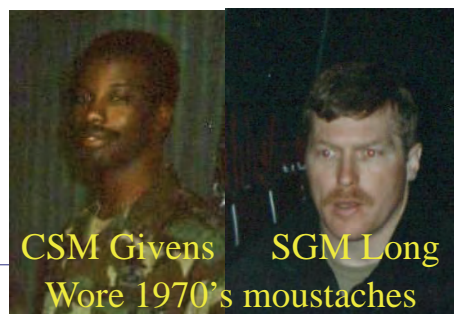
