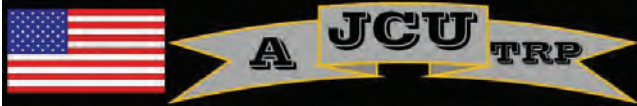

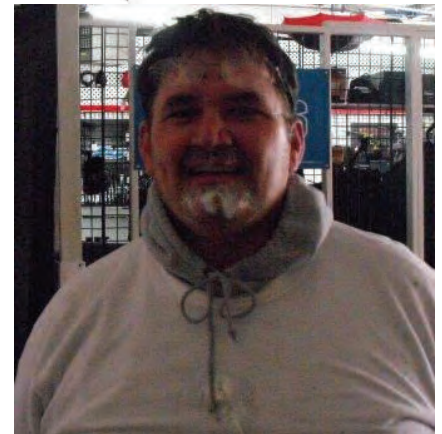

amazing job. His hard work and perseverance has paid off. Olsh has done such a great job that he gets to

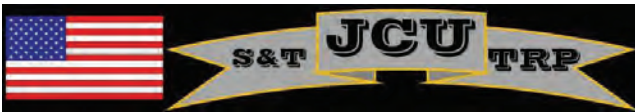

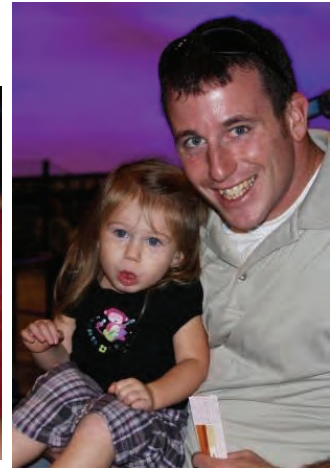
