

As for the remainder of S&T, 1Sgt Leach continues to prove himself as an invaluable asset to the unit by planning and



JFK-50 Mile Hagerstown, Maryland (America's Ultra-marathon)



This year marked the 48th Annual JFK-50 Mile Ultra-marathon. As with every year, it was an outstanding event. We had 31 runners compete this year. 24 of our own and 7 friends of the community that were either here at one time or that we work with us around the globe. The weather was excellent this year. The JCU record of 8:37, held by Josh Smith still stands, but our fastest runner this year was Robert Giovannetti with a time of 9:16. There were a lot of 1st time runners this year, congratulations to everyone that participated this year. The Appalachian Trail was still as brutal as always and the C&O Canal path was still 26 miles by itself. There were no major injuries to note as of right now, just a few twisted ankles and lost toe nails, but the crew survived and lived to tell their stories.

This year we had two military teams entered. Haigh's Heroes and Team IO. Haigh's Heroes placed 4th and Team IO took 6th place overall in the military team competition behind what may be considered collegiate athletes, the Navy Annapolis cadets and West Point cadets. 
