Message from the Commander

First I'd like to apologize for this newsletter being so late. Todd has been ready for weeks but has been waiting on me so I apologize to all of you and to Todd for making this late.

Operationally, the Reliefin-Place between D and C Troop went extremely well, probably the smoothest I've seen. It's a testament to the great preparatory work that both troops did to prepare the handover responsibilities. Back home we've had some excellent training events in New Mexico, New York, and Washington State. It is very important for the unit to train in other geographic locations. It builds experience working with different satellites and teleports that make it far easier and quicker to establish communications when we have to do it for real.

I want to give you a heads up that we are going to make a change to the cycle system. Basically we are adjusting the order of the cycles. The new method will be recovery, alert, training, deployment. This will enable the Troops to focus training on the next mission they will execute, in

other words do the drills required prior to alert cycle and concentrate on manning the forward sites prior to the deployment cycle. It also fixes the concern that under the current cycle schedule if someone gets deployed on the alert cycle it could impact their ability to replace the deployed Troop which could impact when they return. That wouldn't be good. I would have preferred to have started with the schedule we are about to implement, but we just didn't have enough Service Members in the line troops to be able implement a year and a half ago. Now we do and it will be big improvement. Importantly, thanks to OPS for figuring out how to do it smoothly, no deployment schedules will change.

I want to share something that happened recently. When I was redeploying earlier this month I got impacted by the big snowstorms in DC. First, there were multiple delays while still overseas as flights got delayed due to weather on the East Coast. We finally took off for our 13 hour flight into Wash DC. One hour out we got redirected to New York due to the snow. Spent 3 hours on hold on the phone with SATO Travel (I never did

get through) trying to change my flights, missed a chance to get at least to Raleigh, paid for my own ticket the next morning, etc. etc. etc. Bottom line I was still fuming the next morning knowing that I had another TDY I had to go on within a day of getting home. My Irish was up, I was hot. As we took off the next day from JFK in NYC the plane at the banked moment and I got a great view of the NYC skyline. It all came into perspective. Something is missing, the Twin Towers. Sometimes vou get reminded of what it is all about. I guess the travel delays didn't suck so bad after all.

Again I'd like to thank all the families and the Unit Members for all you have sacrificed over the last 9 years of war and the sacrifices you will continue to make as we strive to defend our way of life against a determined enemy. Most of our nation doesn't understand the severity of what we are up against. You do and you stand up and make a difference. Thank you.
