Message from the JCU Chaplain

"At JCU we want you leaving with the same family you came with." COL James Clifford

Over the past few months I have been involved in a number of events that focused on relationships. Beginning with the JCU Family event in July, to a marriage retreat about a month ago and an Evening to Remember just last week, each of these focused on the vital role of **communication**.

During the JCU family event in Williamsburg, Virginia parents and kids were able to work on projects and craft assignments



based on certain criteria. The easiest were the individual projects. For example I asked everyone, kids and parents, to draw "how to make toast" on a piece of paper using crayons and markers. At the end of the allotted time there were a wide variety of examples ranging from the basic steps to detailed versions that included a quad chart showing the post-toasting butter process.

Things got interesting when I asked for the same thing on poster-board with the added direction that the whole family had to do it together. Upon reflection, many said it was more difficult as a family since family members brought different ideas and expectations to the project. In the end someone usually took charge... or was given charge... and the project got done. We surmised that when doing something as a family unit communication or lack of it was key element.

At a Marriage retreat several weeks later the couples attending discussed the same principle within the marriage relationship. The value of open, honest and intentional communication was a major theme in that weekend. We determined that good communication includes active listening as well as direct language when sharing thoughts and feelings. The truth is when husbands and wives learn to listen well and share thoughts, feelings, and ideas in a healthy way, children learn as well. In the end good communication makes a stronger family.

As the Chaplain of DOD's Finest Communicators, my hope and desire is that we will be just as good – if not better - at communicating in our homes as we are in all the places we work. Our families are the backbone of this unit. While it may take time, patience or even training and counseling, communication skills are worth developing.
